

## **Thirty-Eight C. C. C. Men Selected From Hampshire County**

Forty-five young men between the ages of 18 and 28 years were taken to Petersburg Monday by Ralph Haines, Relief Administrator, for entrance in the Civilian Conservation Corps. Thirty-eight passed physical examinations and were selected to remain in the camp. These men will receive subsistence, clothing, medical attention, opportunities for education and a varied recreational program, besides a monthly cash allowance.

The work which will be done in State or National Forests, will include making of trails, roads, planting of trees, fire towers, landscaping and other work in the parks.
